Location

This 375 year old fortified desert home of the descendants of the Rathores lies on the banks of a small lake (sometimes empty in the dry season) which teems with birdlife, just south of Jodhpur. The family still reside here and run the hotel which has been beautifully restored in traditional Rajput style. It is a rambling, low rise building with various wings surrounding grassy courtyards and a very pretty garden, alive with roses and flowers. It is in the middle of the small village of Rohet and is surrounded by the scrublands of the Great Thar Desert.

Accessibility

By air: To Jodhpur, from Delhi, Bombay, Jaipur, Udaipur, followed by a 45 minute car journey.

By train: To Jodhpur, from Delhi, Bombay, Jaipur, Agra, Bikaner, Jaisalmer, followed by a 45 minute car journey.

By road: An easy drive from Nimaj, Khimsar, Nagaur, Manwar, Osian, Narlai, Ghanerao, Deogarh. A longer drive from Jaisalmer, Bikaner, Pushkar, Roopangarh, Udaipur, Jaipur.

Transfers: The hotel is happy to arrange transfers (at extra cost) from either the airport or the railway station to / from the hotel.

Accommodation

Accommodation comprises 29 rooms and 6 suites. Of these, 15 are twin, 14 double and 2 single rooms. Certain rooms have views of the swimming pool, lake or horses. One room has a Lake View balcony and another has a Lake View terrace. The 6 suites are large and spacious with sitting areas or balconies or terraces.

All rooms are air-conditioned and have overhead fans, hairdryers (on request), safes, telephones, internet access and attached bathrooms. Tea and coffee making facilities are available in the

suites. On account of the building not being purpose built, all rooms vary in shape, size and design. They are scattered around the building and courtyards, mostly on the ground floor. All the rooms are well decorated, with great taste and with colourful block-printed fabrics and local furnishings. The majority are light and airy. There are rooms with easy access for wheelchairs. Hot water bottles are provided on particularly cold nights. Hot water is plentiful and provided by geyser. One bottle of complimentary mineral water per person per day is provided on request in the bedrooms.

Room 6 – 9 face over the swimming pool. Rooms 12, 21 – 27 have views of the lake. Room 31 is for horse lovers and faces the stable courtyard. Room 15 has a lake view terrace.

All accommodation is on a bed and breakfast basis.

Dining

There is one lovely, tented, rooftop restaurant which overlooks the swimming pool and which serves Continental and Indian cuisine. The hotel offers a buffet service, table d'hote and a la carte dining. There is a poolside, air-conditioned restaurant, terrace dining and private dining. Snacks can also be taken outside the main sitting room by the shady verandah and tea is usually served in the hugely pretty garden. Tea, evening drinks and private dinners can also be taken on the new roof terrace which overlooks the lake and is a lovely change of venue.

Children

The resort accepts children of all ages. Children may be accommodated in their parent's bedroom for an extra charge. There is a baby-sitting service available, upon request.

Dress code

There is no official dress code. However, many find themselves changing into something a little tidier for dinner.

Check-in / out time

Midday. Extended check-out is subject to negotiation/availability.

Electricity

220 volts. The standard two round pin adaptors work.

Credit cards / currency

The resort accepts Visa and Mastercard. It does not accept payment in foreign currency (rupees only) and neither does it accept travellers cheques.

Mobile telephones

Mobile telephones do not work here.

When to go / Climate

Rajasthan has some major climactic fluctuations. During December, January and February, it can be cold in the mornings and evenings and warm clothes are necessary at these times.

During the daytime it is lovely and warm and sunny. March and April are getting fairly hot and it begins to get very hot and humid in May and June and temperatures can rise to an intense and uncomfortable heat. The monsoon breaks in July and lasts until September. October and November are still warm but not cold or wet. The best time to visit is from October to early April. It is generally a dry heat with very little humidity.

Opening and closing

The hotel remains open 365 days per year.

Pests

Due to the dry heat of Rajasthan, mosquitoes are not a major problem but they do tend to come out in the evenings and early mornings, throughout the year and particularly in the warmer months. The hotel provides mosquito coils and repellents in the rooms to combat this. It is not advisable to leave windows open that do not have mesh insect protection, when your lights on as bugs will tend to fly in.
